

THE OCEAN HAS NO BORDERS



SHIFTING FEEDING PATTERNS:

Studies have shown that right whales' primary food source has shifted out of Maine waters over the past decade, drawing the whales into new waters with fewer protections. They are rarely found in Maine Lobster fishing grounds, the majority of which are close to shore.



FAIRNESS IN DATA:

Current evaluations assign 50% of "unknown" deaths and serious injuries to the U.S., a point that simply isn't backed up by what we know about whale injuries and deaths.



ONE SIZE DOES NOT FIT ALL:

All areas and fishing gear do not pose the same risk to right whales. Solutions must be scaled to protect right whales where they are in most danger. WE WANT TO BE PART OF THE SOLUTION. WE ARE ALWAYS OPEN AND WILLING TO SIT DOWN AND GO OVER MEASURES THAT WOULD WORK FOR US AND FOR THE RIGHT WHALES.

ENSURING EFFECTIVE SOLUTIONS

The future of the Maine Lobster fishery relies on effective protection of endangered right whales, which is why every Maine lobsterman has a vested interest in finding solutions that work.

For decades, lobstermen have proactively worked to ensure not only the continued sustainability of the lobster population but also as environmental stewards of the marine environment on which they rely.

The Maine Lobster industry contributes more than \$1 billion to the state economy each year, employing thousands on and off the water. The effectiveness of current proposed federal regulations have yet to be proven, are not backed by sound scientific data, and could be financially devastating to the fishery--impacting the bedrock of Maine's coastal economy.
